

Zero landfill is the **shortened version of "zero waste to landfill"**, which **means exactly what it sounds like - sending nothing to the landfill**. Instead, **zero waste to landfill focuses on diversion methods**, such as **upcycling or recycling items that would normally be thrown away**, both of which are better for the environment. However, zero landfill also includes methods like incineration, which involves burning trash in waste-to-energy plants. How Amwaste, LLC defines ONE-BIN collection:

ONE-BIN service allows the resident to comingle recyclable materials with what have traditionally been considered non-recyclables. The collected material is taken to a state-of-the-art facility designed to source separate the waste. This allows a significantly higher volume of materials to be recycled/repurposed in comparison to a traditional single-stream collection and processing operation. Although the traditional program may yield a slightly cleaner end-product for actual recycling, due to increasing demand from the end-user for a "cleaner product", the volume of residual material to be landfilled is significantly increased.
